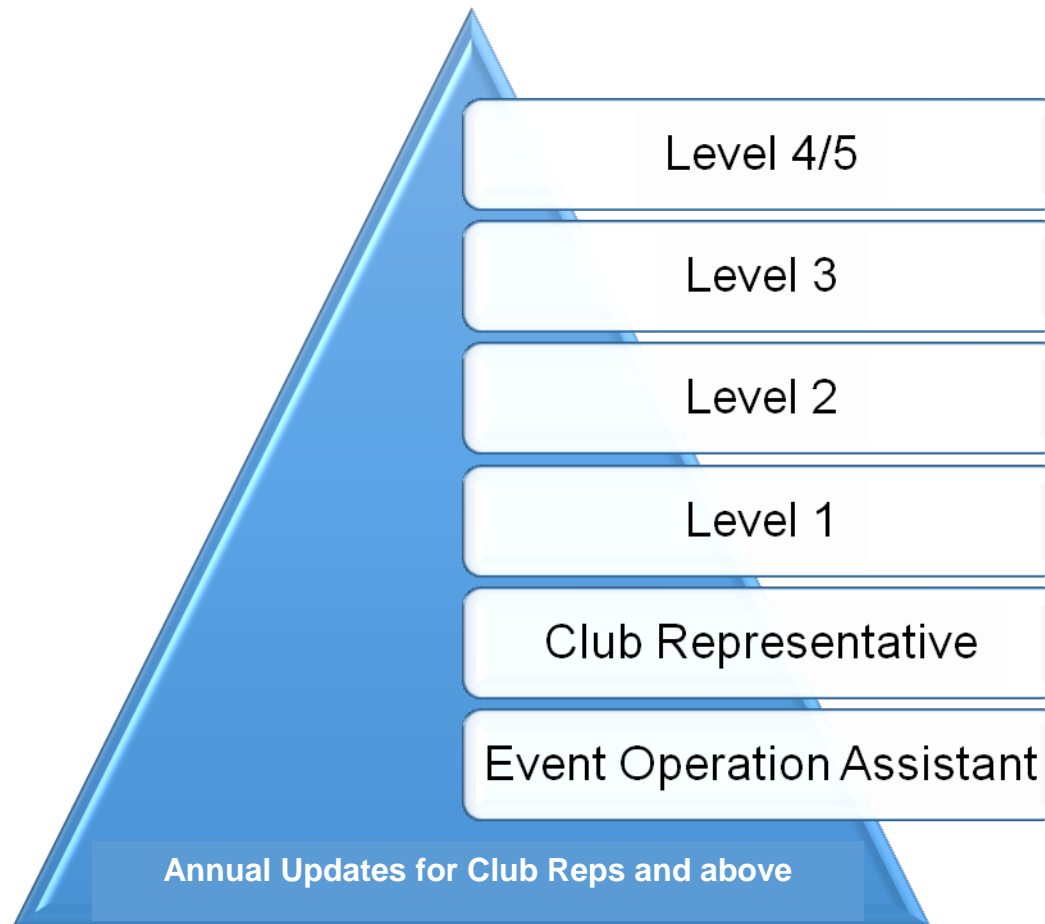

Step 1: Serve a Head Umpire at a Provincial Championship and Step 2: Serve as Head Umpire at a Provincial Arena Championship. Receive positive evaluations during Step 1 and 2, and a recommendation from Member Association.
